

## **Personal Licence Holders**

Further to employer demand, Canterbury College is pleased to be offering the Level 2 Award for Personal Licence Holders.

This one day course is aimed specifically at those who work in licensed premises or any venue or site where alcohol is sold.

It is a legal requirement in England and Wales that anyone wishing to sell or authorise the sale of alcohol must hold a 'Personal Licence' which will be issued by their local authority. Successful completion of this one day course and multiple choice exam will provide candidates with the licensing qualification needed to apply for this Licence.

The course will run from 9.30am -5.00pm on the following days:

14th September
9th November
11th January
29th February
18th April
13th June

The cost for the course and exam which is taken at the end of the day is £150.00 exempt of VAT.

During the course you will learn the following:

 The roles, responsibilities and functions of licensing authorities within the framework of the licensing objectives

- The application process for a personal licence
- The role and legal responsibilities of the personal licence holder, and the penalties relating to failure to comply with the law
- The premises licence
- The content and purpose of operating schedules
- The role and duties of the designated premises supervisor
- Unauthorised and temporary licensable activities
- Rights of entry to licensed premises
- Police powers with regard to suspension and closure of licensed premises
- The specific prohibitions for the sale of alcohol
- The strengths of alcoholic drinks, and the effects of alcohol on the human body
- The protection of children from harm
- The responsible retail sale of alcohol.
